

Transfer Agreement with SANTA MONICA COLLEGE

United States University (USU) is a regionally accredited institution of higher learning offering degrees in information technology, business, education, health sciences and nursing with a mission to serve underserved groups through campus and online courses that are affordable, accessible, and relevant.

Santa Monica College is a regionally accredited institution offering certificates and associate degrees in business, education, computer information systems, and nursing. Santa Monica College's academic programs and support services are intended to serve diverse individuals from local, national, and global communities who are seeking high-quality, affordable undergraduate education.

Both institutions acknowledge that each is committed to providing educational opportunities and services. Neither institution shall discriminate and is dedicated to serving students from all walks of life, regardless of race, ethnicity, sex, gender, sexual orientation, disability, color, age, national origin, medical disabilities/conditions (as defined by law) or any basis prohibited by law.

United States University (USU) has entered into a Transfer Agreement with Santa Monica College. This document shall be effective October 25, 2020.

Either participating party may terminate this agreement at the close of any school year (June 30) by proper written notice delivered to the Articulation Officer at USU or Santa Monica College school official. This agreement shall remain in force for one (1) year wherein it will be reviewed for renewal every two (2) years and/or upon significant changes to either curriculum. This review may include assessment of program or course learning outcomes.

United States University will accept Santa Monica College graduates with an associate's degree for transfer into USU's RN to BSN program under the following terms:

- a) Completed degree with a Grade Point Average of 2.0 or above ("C" grade or better for each course);
- b) Satisfy all institutional general admissions and program specific admission requirements, if applicable.

To obtain a baccalaureate degree at United States University, students are required to complete the courses outlined (or their approved equivalent) in the attached transfer guide, including any prerequisites. A minimum of 30 credits must be completed at USU in order to confer the bachelor's degree with a minimum total semester credit hours equal to 120.
